Thank you all so much for your support in helping to raise much needed funds for the



Dropping and collecting your child Rainbow Class

- Please can you support your child to hang their own coat, find their name card and put on their water bottle before handing them to a staff member at the door, ensuring your child has been escorted into the middle room before leaving them. For safeguarding reasons please do not enter the middle room. When collecting your children, we are asking for parents to come in and form a queue and we will hand over each child in turn. You will then be able to collect their belongings and head off.
- Please arrive on time, however. if you are late to drop off, please go to reception. You will be asked to wait until a staff member is free to collect your child, as this can cause a lot of disruption to the other children's learning.

Snowflake Class - Drop off please come inside the gate and make your way to the main reception. Please collect your children from the yellow garden gate in the car park.

If Your Child Is Unwell

If your child is unwell or not coming to nursery for any reason, please call the office or leave a message on the answer phone. We have a duty of care to follow up any absences on the first day so please do make this call.

Donations

What to bring to nursery - Please ensure all clothes and belongings are clearly named in a ruck sack or cloth bag. NO PLASTIC CARRIER BAGS PLEASE. This is for safety and ecological reasons. Wet bags are an easy way to store wet/dirty clothes. They are a reusable, waterproof and leak resistant bag that zips shut to help keep odours (and liquids) from escaping.

- Water bottle this will go home each day (please only fill with water)
- Wellington boots to leave at nursery
- A warm water proof jacket and trousers (or all in one) to leave at nursery
- Hat, scarf and gloves
- Nappies and wipes (if applicable)
- Spare clothes including underwear and plenty of socks

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Please **DO NOT** put toys, food, medication, creams or any other items not listed above in your child's bag.

<u>Reminders</u>

Lunch boxes

- We have a staff member and child with severe nut allergies please DO NOT pack anything containing nuts in your child's lunch box. Please note: nuts are often hidden in foods such as spreads, sauces and chocolate, so please check food labels.
- Please chop foods such as grapes, cherry tomatoes and sausages
- Please do not put smoothies or juices in your child's lunch box we provide water for lunch times.

Celebrations

- If you are celebrating any festivals or special occasions at home please let us know so we can share this at Nursery
- Please read and like our weekly Curriculum Catch Up- this gives you a really good insight to what the children are learning and what you can do at home to support this.
- Remember to share your home learning with us on Tapestry. The children very much enjoy showing their friends and team.

2yr old provision
